

CHAP. 264. to be known as sections eighteen and nineteen, be and the
 Repeal. same is hereby repealed, and said sections 18 and 19 are hereby
 re-enacted so as to read as follows: That two additional
 New sections sections to be known as sections eighteen and nineteen be and
 added. the same are hereby added to Article 99 of the Code of Public
 General Laws of Maryland, entitled "Wild Fowl, Birds and
 Game," so as to read as follows:

Game law. Section 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to trap,
 catch or kill any otter, mink, raccoon or muskrat within this
 State, or have the same in his possession if trapped, caught or
 killed within this State, between the first day of April and
 the first day of January in each year.

Penalty for violation. Section 19. Any person violating the preceding section
 shall on conviction pay a fine of not less than five dollars or
 more than twenty dollars for each and every otter, mink,
 raccoon or muskrat trapped, caught, killed or in his possession,
 contrary to the provisions of the preceding section; and in
 default of payment of fine or fines imposed hereunder,
 together with the costs, the offender shall be committed to jail
 for not less than ten or more than thirty days for each offense;
 one-half of all fines to go to the informer. The provisions of
 this Act shall not apply to Harford, Cecil, Charles, Anne
 Arundel, Carroll, St. Mary's, Baltimore and Garrett counties.

CHAPTER 265.

AN ACT to repeal Section one hundred and twenty-seven of
 Article twenty-one of the Code of Public Local Laws, of
 Maryland, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Liquor and Intox-
 icating Drinks," as amended by Chapter 156, Acts of 1898,
 and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to add two
 additional sections to said Article 21, to follow Section one
 hundred and twenty-seven of said Article and to be desig-
 nated as Sections 127 A and 127 B, being an Act to prohibit
 the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer or
 other intoxicating liquors in the Fourth or Chapel Election
 District of Talbot County.

Repeal. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of
 Maryland,* That section one hundred and twenty-seven of
 Article twenty-one of the Code of Public Local Laws of
 Maryland, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Liquor and Intox-
 icating Drinks," as amended by chapter 156, Acts of 1898, be
 and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amend-
