CHAPTER 484.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Washington County to levy a sum of money to refund to Harry F. Miller, of said county, certain taxes erroneously paid by him.

Sum of money to be levied.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the County Commissioners of Washington county be and the same are hereby authorized and directed to levy for the use of Harry F. Miller, of said county, the sum of four dollars and twenty cents, amount of county taxes erroneously paid by him for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
