CHAPTER 595.

AN ACT to refund Robert W. Adams a sum of money paid by him to the Comptroller of the Treasury of the State, and covered into the Treasury of the State, for license to dredge for oysters with the schooner Florence Northam, which schooner was wrecked about four months prior to the expiration of the said license.

Preamble. WHEREAS, Robert W. Adams, on the 28th day of October, A. D., 1901, procured a license from the Comptroller of the Treasury for the schooner Florence Northam to dredge for oysters for the season ending March the 15th, 1902;

WHEREAS, The said schooner Florence Northam was wrecked on the twenty-first day of November, 1901, about four months before the expiration of said license, said license only having run up to the time of the loss of said schooner; therefore,

Warrant to be issued.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the treasury of the State, in favor of Robert W. Adams, of Somerset county, for the sum of eighty-four dollars and sixty cents (\$84.60), as hereinbefore recited, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 596.

AN ACT to refund to Achilles Ford, brother of William G. Ford, late of Baltimore City, deceased, the sum of eighty-nine dollars and fifty-one cents, being balance of a sum of money erroneously paid as collateral inheritance tax by him to Stephen R. Mason, Register of Wills of Baltimore City, on the estate of William G. Ford, deceased, and which sum of money was covered into the Treasury by said Register of Wills.

Warrant to be issued.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State of Maryland for the sum of eighty-nine dollars and fifty-one cents, in favor of the said Achilles Ford,
