

Seventeenth. To the bequest contained in the said will of said Margaret Scotten of three hundred dollars to Reverend Thomas S. Holt, a Methodist Episcopal minister, stationed in Caroline county, Maryland.

Eighteenth. To two bequests contained in the last will and testament of Mary S. Martindale, late of Chester county, deceased; the first to the trustees in charge of the real estate of East Nottingham Meeting of the Society of Friends, located in Cecil county, Maryland, and known as "The Brick Meeting House;" and secondly, to the trustees of the Friends Meeting, located on Park avenue, in the city of Baltimore.

Nineteenth. To the bequest contained in the last will and testament of Rebecca Woolsey, late of Harford county, deceased, to the trustees of the Churchville Presbyterian Congregation of Harford county.

Twentieth. To the sale, grant and deed made and executed by Charles M. Armstrong and Harriet C.
