

CHAP. 632. Sixtieth. To the following deeds to the Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the Diocese of Maryland, to wit: (A) A deed from Frank William Bolgiano and wife, dated February 28, 1901, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore city, in Liber R. O. No. 1889, folio 315, etc. (B) A deed from Eugene Oudesluya, dated March 11, 1901, recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore city, in Liber R. O. No. 1890, folio 415. (C) A deed from Frank William Bolgiano and wife and Maurice E. Skinner and wife, dated December 11, 1901, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore city, in Liber R. O. No. 1934, folio 377.

Sixty-First. To a bequest of four hundred dollars made to the German Baptist Brethren of the Meadow Branch Congregation in Carroll county, Maryland, by the last will and testament of John Leister, late of Carroll county, deceased, according to the provisions of said will.
