prosecution shall be brought for the sale of any patent or proprietary medicine containing any of the drugs or preparations hereinbefore mentioned until the Maryland Board of Pharmacy shall certify that such medicine contains any of the said drugs or preparations in excess of the maximum percentages hereinbefore mentioned.

How charges may be brought, SEC. 4. In any proceedings under the provisions of this Act the charge may be brought against any or all of the members of a partnership or against the directors or executive officers of a corporation, or against the agent of any person, partnership or corporation.

Institution of criminal proceedings.

SEC. 5. And be it further enacted, That all criminal proceedings pending, or which may be hereafter instituted for offense already committed shall be instituted, proceeded with and prosecuted to final determination and judgment, as if this Act had not been passed.

SEC. 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 7. This Act shall take effect and in force from and after the first day of June, 1906.

CHAPTER 524.

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Washington County," sub-title "Intoxicating Drinks," as amended by Chapter 214 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its January Session, 1898, and to add a new section thereto, to be designated as Section 321½, and providing for a license of five hundred dollars to sell spirituous, fermented or intoxicating liquors within one mile of the corporate limits of Williamsport, in Washington County.

New section added.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a new section, to be designated as Section 321½, be and the same is hereby added to Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Washington County," sub-title "Intoxicating Drinks," as amended by
