Ballots to be provided.

receive any new names, however, to be printed on the official ballot, unless they are included in the papers provided by said political parties, as aforesaid. The supervisors of election shall provide ballots for two political parties in proportion to be hereafter decided upon; the tickets shall be delivered to the judges of election, together with the ballot boxes, books of registry, poll books, stationery and the necessary blanks, in such manner as the supervisors shall hereafter direct. The ballot boxes shall be locked with the key in the lock and contain therein both sets of official ballots, one package of said political party to go in each box, together with such other election paraphernalia as the supervisors may hereafter decide upon. The ballots shall be printed without coupon and are to be indorsed on the back: The official ballot of the primary election of Harford county (the third Saturday in June, with the year it is held), and shall bear the *fac-simile* of the signature of the president of the board of supervisors of elections of Harford county. In printing the tickets of the parties that may adopt what is known as the Crawford county system, the names are to be arranged so that the voter can indicate his choice of the different candidates by marking out the names of those for whom he does not desire to vote. The party or parties who nominate by the county convention system shall have the names of the delegates for which the voter does not care to cast his ballot can be marked out in the same manner as provided above. The candidates for the different offices to be filled shall be grouped under the respective heads. The judges shall not count any ballots that do not bear the official endorsement of the president of the board of supervisors of elections of Harford county.

SEC. 15. *And be it enacted*, That in voting it shall be necessary for the voter to give his name, and after it has been ascertained that he is registered or entitled to be registered under the provisions of Section 6 of this Act he shall be entitled to one ticket of the party to which he states he belongs; the clerks of election shall immediately write the said voter's name on the poll book, giving the same a consecutive number; the voter shall be allowed to take his ticket to any convenient place, outside the enclosure if he shall so select, and prepare the same in accordance with his wishes, after which he shall again give his name to the
