CHAPTER 766.

AN ACT to repeal Section 5 of Article 62 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Marriage," and re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 5 of Article 62 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, "Marriage," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows :

Repeal and re-enact.

Section 5. That before the clerk of any of the Courts aforesaid shall issue any license, he shall examine on oath the person making application for same, to ascertain, first, the full name of the parties ; second, their place of residence ; third, their age ; fourth, their color ; fifth, whether married or single ; sixth, whether related or not, if so, in what degree of relationship ; seventh, if ever divorced ; which facts shall be set out in printed form to be signed by the person making the application.

Applicant to be examined on oath.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect on January 1, 1907.

CHAPTER 767.

AN ACT to extend the privileges and enlarge the powers of The Baltimore and Ocean City Railroad Company, incorporated under the Public General Laws of this State.

SECTION 1: *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That The Baltimore and Ocean City Railway Company, a corporation duly incorporated in the year 1906, under the provisions of Article 23 of the public general laws of this State, sub-title "Railroad Companies," for the purpose
