Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the said bonds authorized to be issued by this Act shall be sold by the said County Commissioners of Worcester county to the best advantage, Bonds to be sold to the and for not less than the par value thereof, and any accrued interest thereon, either at public or private sale, at such time and upon such notice as said board of County Commissioners may deem expedient, and that the money arising from the sale of said bonds shall be kept as a separate fund for the purposes of this Act, and the county treasurer or the clerk to the board of County Commissioners shall keep a full registry of the said bonds, with the names of the purchasers and the amount realized on the sale thereof, and the date of issue, the date of sale and the date of maturity of the several bonds; and when redeemed the said bonds shall at once be cancelled on the face thereof and on the book of registry and not again issued.
