on the first Monday of June and the first Monday of December, respectively, each year; and the two non-jury terms shall commence on the third Monday of March and the second Monday of September, respectively, in each year; and to said jury terms jurors shall be summoned and returned in the mode prescribed by law; and in the trial of any cause in said court the judges or judge presiding shall have the power and authority to employ a stenographer or shorthand reporter to take down proceedings, or shorthand including the testimony for the use of the court; and the County Commissioners shall levy such compensation of such stenographer or shorthand reporter as the court or judges thereof shall approve of, or the court or judge may require; said compensation to be taxes as part of the costs of the cause, and to be paid by either or both of the parties to the cause as the court or judges may deem equitable; provided, that the compensation of said stenographer or shorthand reporter shall not exceed six dollars per diem for the time actually employed.

In all suits and actions at law commenced between the third Monday of March, 1906, and the second Monday Term of court, of September in the same year, process issued thereon or in connection therewith shall be returnable to the September term, as provided for and fixed by this Act; and the first term of said court to be held under the provisions of this Act shall commence on the second Monday of September in the year 1906.

CHAPTER 791.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the Cecil Farmers' Telephone Company of Cecil County, Maryland, by increasing its capital stock.
