Sum of money refunded.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sum of fifty-five dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$55.99) paid by James H. Stigers as executor of Elmar C. Thomas, late of Washington county, deceased, as a collateral inheritance tax upon the sum of twenty-two hundred and thirty-nine dollars and sixty cents (\$2,239.60), be and the same is hereby refunded to the said James H. Stigers, executor, and the Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State for the said sum, to the said James H. Stigers, executor of Elmar C. Thomas deceased.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 809.

AN ACT making appropriations for the support of the State government for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and seven.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That for the expenditures in the support of the State government for the fiscal year beginning with the first day Appropriation of October, nineteen hundred and six, and ending with the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and seven, the government, following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated, that is to say:

For State Officers.

For the salary of the Governor, four thousand five hundred dollars; for the salary of the Secretary of State, two thousand dollars; for the salary of the chief clerk to Governor, eighteen hundred dollars; for the salary of one clerk to the Governor, twelve hundred dollars; for the salary of the messenger to the Governor, one thousand dollars; for the salary of a stenographer to the Governor, nine hundred dollars; for the salary of the Comproller of the Treasury, two thousand five hundred dollars; for the salary of the
