Expiration of licenses.

Section 127 N. And be it enacted. That all licenses issued under the provisions of this Act shall expire at the end of thirty days from their issue, but the holders of said license, if the same have not been used, may apply to the clerk for a renewal of the same for an additional thirty days upon paying to the clerk one dollar as fee for such renewal, but there shall not be more than one renewal thereof.

Unlawful for to sell horses

Section 127 o. And be it enacted, That any person who may undertake to attempt to advertise or sell horses or mules within the limits of Talbot county, not being a citizen non-resident or citizens of said county, may be arrested by an officer of or mules, etc. the county and taken before a justice of the peace for trial, and on conviction shall be fined a sum not less than five hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, and upon failure to pay said fine shall be confined in the county jail for a period of six months, and in addition thereto the horses and mules offered for sale, together with any property of said person or persons shown to be non-residents, may be proceeded against by a non-resident attachment by a proceeding in the name of the State of Maryland, to be instituted by the State's Attorney for the county to recover the amount of said fines and costs.

fourth of fines imposed.

Section 127 P. And be it enacted, That for every apprehension and conviction of any person charged with violation of Entitled to one- the preceding sections, the sheriff, constable or other person giving information that leads to the conviction of such person shall be entitled to receive one-fourth of the fine imposed and collected, which sum shall be paid to such officer or other person by the County Commissioners.
