CHAP. 349

Game law.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be unlawful for any person to shoot, trap, catch or kill, within the limits of Prince George's county, in the State of Maryland, any partridge, pheasant of any variety, woodcock, snipe or rabbit, before the ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven, under penalty of a fine of ten dollars, or imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not less than five days and not exceeding ten days, for each of the aforesaid birds or animals so shot, trapped, caught or killed.

Subject to certain provisions.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all prosecutions, fines, costs, etc., under the provisions of this Act are hereby made subject to the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 253, Acts of the General Assembly of one thousand nine hundred and four.

Suspension of laws.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That all laws or parts of laws inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby suspended during the operation of this Act; provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall apply to the tenth or Laurel election district, the first or Vansville election district, or to the fourteenth or Bowie election district.

SEC. 4. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 142 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Fences," as said section is repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 538 of the Acts of 1904, be and said section is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:

142. If either of the parties keeping a joint fence between arable lands shall refuse or delay to prepare his proportion thereof within twenty days after the award made or given to
