

vice-principal teacher of the high school; and all the said assistant teachers, the grammar school principal teacher, if any, and the said vice-principal teacher, shall be accounted as teachers subordinate to the high school principal teacher.

SEC. 3. For the purposes of this Act manual training teachers and teachers of similar courses shall not be included among the "teachers subordinate to the principal teacher," unless they teach in one school only and are as directly under the control and supervision of the principal teacher of the school as are the assistant teachers of the regular graded courses.

Not to be included.

SEC. 4. When during a school year it shall become necessary to regularly appoint one or more additional teachers to the corps of teachers of a school, or to decrease the number of teachers assigned to a school, the salary of the principal teacher or principal teachers connected with the school shall be correspondingly increased or decreased in accordance with this Act.

Salary may be increased or decreased.

SEC. 5. This Act shall become operative and take effect for the school year of 1906-1907 and succeeding school years.

CHAPTER 438.

AN ACT to change the corporate name of the Maryland Sunday School Union to that of the Maryland Sunday School Association.

WHEREAS, The Maryland Sunday School Union was incorporated by an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the December Session, 1845, Chapter 306, and the said Act was by said General Assembly continued in force perpetually, subject to amendment or repeal, as will appear by reference to Chapter 316, passed at the January Session 1874; and

Preamble.

WHEREAS, It has been represented to the General Assembly that a change of a part of the name of the said body corporate by striking out the word "Union" and substituting the word "Association" in lieu thereof is deemed advisable; therefore,
