If at any election there be any question to be submitted to the popular vote, the said question shall be placed upon Question to be said ballot in full, and shall be voted upon in the form following: "For Proposition," "Against Proposition," and said respective question shall be placed beneath the names of the candidates, as hereinbefore mentioned, and the same shall be voted on in the same manner as for candidates, by drawing a black line through "For Proposition," if against the proposition, and by drawing a black line through "Against Proposition," if for it.
