CHAP. 462

Repeal.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That Section 30 of Chapter 619 of the Acts of 1900, and Section 30 of Chapter 656 of the Acts of 1904, are hereby repealed in so far as the same are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, and no farther.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 463.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Chapter 582 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the Session of 1904, entitled "An Act to incorporate The Glencove Power Manufacturing and Supply Company of Harford County."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Chapter 582 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the Session of 1904, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, to read as follows:

Repeal and re-enact.

Authority to supply electricity for heating, etc.

2. And be it further enacted, That said company is hereby authorized and empowered to supply the public, including individuals, municipalities and corporations within the limits of Harford county and Cecil county, electric current for heating, lighting, driving machinery or for any other purposes whatever, for which such current can or may be used, and to fix, charge, collect and receive rates and tolls therefor; and for the purpose of enabling said company to supply such power as aforesaid, said company is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase, acquire, hold and own real estate, water rights, excepting the water rights of the Susquehanna river in said counties, and rights of way, and to locate, acquire, construct, equip, maintain and operate such suitable plant or plants as may be required, and to increase and enlarge the same as may be necessary; and to locate, acquire, equip, maintain and operate by the most practical routes, to be determined by the board of directors of said company, lines for the transmission of current or power by wires, on poles or underground, or by cables or any or all other convenient appliances for the transmission of current or power to any and all points within the limits of said counties, and
