CHAPTER 465.

AN ACT to regulate the building of Blinds in the Chesapeake Bay, opposite the shore line of Anne Arundel county, on the western side of said bay.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of the Chesapeake Bay, oppoblinds, etc. site the shore line of Anne Anrundel county, on the western side of said bay, without having obtained from the clerk of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county an annual license for said blind.

- SEC. 2. And be it enacted. That any applicant for a license to build a blind as set forth in the first section of this Act License fee. shall pay to the clerk of the Circuit Court a license fee of five dollars.
- SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That after licensing and location of said blind no person shall locate another blind within Blinds must seven hundred yards of said blind.

SEC 4. And be it enacted, That no blind so located shall at Unlawful to any time be placed in over eight feet of water or over one place blinds in over 8 feet thousand yards from the Anne Arundel county shore line.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That any person violating the provisions of this Act shall, upon conviction before any Fine imposed. justice of the peace of Anne Arundel county, be fined not less than five or more than twenty-five dollars for each and every violation of this Act.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
