CHAPTER 465.

AN ACT to regulate the building of Blinds in the Chesapeake Bay, opposite the shore line of Anne Arundel county, on the western side of said bay.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this Act it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any booby blind or brush blind within the waters of the Chesapeake Bay, opposite the shore line of Anne Arundel county, on the western side of said bay, without having obtained from the clerk of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county an annual license for said blind.

Unlawful to build booby blinds, etc.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any applicant for a license to build a blind as set forth in the first section of this Act shall pay to the clerk of the Circuit Court a license fee of five dollars.

License fee.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That after licensing and location of said blind no person shall locate another blind within seven hundred yards of said blind.

Blinds must be 700 yards apart.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That no blind so located shall at any time be placed in over eight feet of water or over one thousand yards from the Anne Arundel county shore line.

Unlawful to place blinds in over 8 feet of water, etc.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That any person violating the provisions of this Act shall, upon conviction before any justice of the peace of Anne Arundel county, be fined not less than five or more than twenty-five dollars for each and every violation of this Act.

Fine imposed.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 465½.
