

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the authorized capital stock of said company shall be ten thousand dollars. CHAP. 496  
Capital stock.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the stockholders are hereby empowered to organize by electing such directors and officers as they may deem necessary to properly conduct the business of the company; such election shall be held annually in the month of April, the president to fix the day; the president may also call an extra or special meeting whenever he deems it necessary, or whenever requested to do so by three or more stockholders of said company. Directors to be  
elected.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That the said corporation shall have power to pass all by-laws necessary to carry out the purposes for which it is hereby created. By-laws passed

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

#### CHAPTER 497.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Barton, Alleghany County, Maryland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the citizens of the town of Barton, in Alleghany county, shall be and they are hereby constituted and made a body corporate by the name of the "Commissioners of Barton," with all the privileges of a municipal corporation, by that name to sue and be sued, to have and use a common seal, and have perpetual succession. Body

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the corporate limits of said town shall be as follows: Beginning at a cucumber tree standing on the north side of the Potomac tram road and running thence north  $28\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 500 feet to an oak tree; thence north 10 degrees east 300 feet to a hickory tree; thence north 20 degrees east 530 feet to an oak tree; thence north  $28\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 436 feet to a beech tree; thence north  $2\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 250 feet to a thorn bush; thence north  $28\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 1,044 feet to a leaning oak tree; thence north 39 degrees east 857 feet a telegraph pole; thence north 60 degrees west 1,150 feet to a sugar tree; thence south  $87\frac{3}{4}$  degrees west 500 feet to a locust tree; thence north 59 degrees west 256 feet to a post; Corporate  
limits.
