

election, who shall conduct the election at such place and in such manner as they shall elect; the polls shall be opened at 3 o'clock P. M., and close at 6 o'clock P. M. The first election under this act shall be held on the first Monday in May, 1894, and Ernest B. Horn, Andrew J. Baker and Raymond Barnes are hereby appointed judges for that purpose.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the mayor shall appoint annually a bailiff for said town, which appointment shall be subject to the approval of the council; before said bailiff enters upon the discharge of his duties, he shall file with the clerk of said corporation a bond, with security to be approved by the mayor and council, made to the said corporation, for the faithful discharge and performance of his duties under this article, and under the ordinances passed by said council; and in the execution of the duties of office within the corporate limits of said town, he shall have all the powers and authority of a constable; he shall pay over to the clerk and treasurer all moneys coming into his hands for and on account of said corporation; he shall be collector of all taxes levied by said corporation, and shall collect said taxes by distress or execution in the same manner as the county taxes for Carroll county are now collected, and shall for that purpose have all the powers and indemnities in his office that tax collectors of the county taxes of Carroll county now have; he shall, immediately upon the collection of any money for taxes, pay the same over to the clerk and treasurer of the corporation, and shall be subject to suit on his bond and criminal prosecution as the tax collectors of Carroll county now are; he shall receive the same fees in the performance of his duties as bailiffs or constables do in like cases and for like services, and such compensation for the collection of taxes and other duties as shall be provided by ordinance of the corporation.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That the council and other officers of the corporation shall, before they enter upon the duties of their offices, make oath that they will diligently and faithfully, to the best of their skill and judgment, perform the duties of their office, and shall file a certificate thereof, signed by the officers before whom said oath was made, among the records of the corporation.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That the council shall receive all returns of election and determine all questions arising thereon; but any citizen of said town, interested in such determination.
