

citizen of the United States; third, the place of birth of the applicant, and if a naturalized citizen, where and when he was naturalized; fourth, the name of the owner of the premises on which the business licensed is to be carried on; fifth, that the applicant is not, or, if the application be by a firm, that none of the applicants is, in any manner pecuniarily interested in the profits of any business conducted at any other place in said county where any spirituous or fermented liquors are sold or kept for sale; sixth, the kind of license desired, whether to sell in quantities not less than a pint and not to be drunk on the premises; or by the drink, and in quantities not more than four and seven-eighths gallons; or by the drink, and in quantities not more than a quart; and whether for the purpose of opening or keeping a saloon or restaurant, or an ordinary or hotel; and if for the purpose of opening or keeping an ordinary or hotel, that he has, bona fide, and without intending to evade the requirements of this law, provided and expects to maintain at least six good beds with sufficient covering therefor, and three rooms more than sufficient for the private uses of the keeper of said ordinary or hotel, with stabling and provender for at least five horses; seventh, the particular place where the business is to be conducted under the license sought, specifying the same by definite designation and description; eighth, that no person except the applicant or applicants is in any manner pecuniarily interested in the business to be licensed, and that no other person shall be in any manner pecuniarily interested therein; and which said application shall be verified by the affidavit of the applicant, made before the clerk of the court to whom the application is made; and if any false statement is made in any part of said application, the applicant or applicants shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and upon indictment and conviction shall be punished accordingly, and any license issued upon such application shall be suppressed.

**Certificate to be filed with application.** SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That there shall be annexed to said application a certificate signed by at least nine reputable freeholders, bona fide residents of the neighborhood in which the applicant proposes to conduct the business under the license applied for, in which each of the persons certifying shall state his residence or place of business; that he is over twenty-five years of age; how long he has known the applicant; that he believes the statements made in the application to be true; that from his knowledge of the applicant or applicants, and his acquaintance with him or them, he believes the applicant to be a proper person or the applicants to be proper
