authorized to act in his place, for whose acts he shall be responsible, and to whom he may pay such compensation as he may deem proper, to be deducted from his salary; and said treasurer shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred salary. dollars, and the further sum of twenty-five cents for each person's property assessed by him, and five cents for each dog or bitch returned to the County Commissioners, and by them ordered to be entered on the assessment books of the county, but dogs in the incorporated towns which impose a tax thereon shall not be assessed by the County Commissioners; said treasurer shall, before entering upon the duties of his office. execute to the State of Maryland two bonds with sureties, to Bonds. be approved by the County Commissioners, one for fifteen thousand dollars, conditional for the faithful collection and payment to the State Treasurer of all State taxes levied and placed in his hands for collection, and the faithful performance of all other duties devolving on him, and another bond for twenty five thousand dollars, conditional for the proper collection and disbursement of all taxes levied and placed in his hands for Kent county, and the faithful performance of all other duties devolving on him, said bonds to be filed and recorded in the office of the clerk of the Circuit Court for said county.

SEC. 223. It shall be the duty of the treasurer each year as soon as the annual levy is made to give public notice thereof Notice of by advertisement, inserted in two newspapers printed and published in said county, and the taxes so levied shall be due and payable on the first day of September of the year in which they are so levied. It shall be the duty of the said treasurer in the month of September in each year, to sit for To receive two days at the principal town in each election district of said county, and in the months of October and November, one day in each of said town in each election district as aforesaid, for the purpose of receiving taxes; due notice of each of said sittings shall be given by advertisement as hereinbefore provided, and he shall report to the County Commissioners at their first regular meeting in each month, the amount of taxes, State and county, separately collected by him up to the date of such report and the amounts of disbursements made, and Deposits in bank. the balance in hand, and he shall deposit at least once a week in one or more of the banks in Chestertown, all taxes received or collected by him up to the date of such deposit; the portion due to the State to his credit as collector of State taxes, and the portion due the county to his credit as treasurer
