bidder, from whom they shall require a good and sufficient bond, for an amount and with a surety or sureties to be by them approved, conditioned to the faithful performance of the said contract according to the plans and specifications adopted and by them submitted to said contractor for that purpose, provided that the whole cost of said building shall not exceed the sum of one thousand dollars.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 33.

AN ACT to amend Article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Appeals and Error," sub-title "Appeals from Courts of Law," by adding an additional section thereto, to be designated as Section 10 A.

New section. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Appeals and Error," sub-title "Appeals from Courts of Law," be and the same is hereby amended by adding an additional section thereto, to follow section ten, and be designated as section 10 A, and to read as follows:

Seal unnecessary. 10 A. It shall not be necessary for the judge who signs a bill of exceptions to affix his seal thereto.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
