

registering of his or its said business may be proved by a certificate of said collector, or any of his deputies, or by the sworn testimony of him or any of them, and the copy of the application of any person, house, company, association or body corporate, for registry under said revenue laws, made and attested by said collector or any of his deputies, shall be prima facie proof of such application.

Penalty.

SEC. 185. If any druggist or pharmacist shall violate any of the preceding sections, he shall be liable to the same penalties which are set forth in section one hundred and eighty-two.

Fines, how applied.

SEC. 186. One-half of all such fines shall be paid to the informer, and the balance shall be paid to the Board of School Commissioners of the county, for the use of the public schools therein.

Powers of justices of the Peace.

SEC. 187. All prosecutions for the violations of any of the provisions of this sub-title of this article shall be upon presentment and indictment; but any justice of the peace of the county shall have the same authority to receive information of violations thereof, and to take recognizances and bail, or to commit, as is now exercised by justices of the peace of the county under the Public General Laws of this State.

Indictments.

SEC. 188. In any indictment for violation of the provisions of this sub title of this article, it shall be necessary, except in the case of cider, to specify the particular kind of liquor which any person, house, company, association or body corporate, bartered, sold or gave away, or solicited or received orders for the purchase of, or kept deposited, or had with the intent to barter, sell or give away, or that the same had been bartered, sold or given away, in violation of said provisions; but it shall be sufficient if the indictment set forth that the traverser bartered, sold or gave away, or solicited, or received orders for the purchase of or kept deposited or had with the intent to barter, sell or give away, any spirituous or fermented liquors, or intoxicating drinks, or with intent that the same be bartered, sold or given away in violation of said provisions.
