SEC. 129. The clerk of the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's county shall receive annually as a compensation for his services, such sum as County Commissioners may deem proper, not exceeding eight hundred dollars; and said clerk is empowered to administer an oath or affirmation to any account to any person presenting a claim to the commissioners against the county, and he shall be allowed to charge such persons the sum of ten cents for every such oath or affirmation so administered.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 459.

AN ACT to repeal Section 43 of the Code of Public General Laws, Article 77, title "Public Education," sub-title "Schools," so far as the same applies to "Allegany County," and to add a new section to Article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Allegany County," to be sub-titled and sectioned with a proper regard to its location in said Article one.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section 43 of article 77 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Public Education," sub-title "Schools," so far as the same applies to Allegany county, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that a new section be and the same is hereby added to article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Allegany County," to be sub-titled and numbered with a proper regard to its location in said article one, and to read as follows :

SEC. —. Whenever the number of children attending any school in Allegany county, in any school district thereof, is greater than one hundred, the board of county school commissioners may, with the consent of the board of district school
