

wharf and thence with the public county road to Blinkborn School House, then up Cabin Creek road to the house where C. H. Prouse now resides, thence with the county road to a pond known as Bonner's bay, then down the branch and mill stream leading to upper Cabin creek mill, until it crosses the county road leading from Cabin creek to Shilo church, and with said road to the county road leading from East New Market to Rhodesdale, and with said road to the fork district line, and with said line to the Nanticoke river, and up said river to the place of beginning.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That all persons now residing within the limits aforesaid, and who are registered voters in either of the said election districts from which is carved the new district of Hurlock, shall be entitled to register and vote in said new district, upon presenting to the register thereof their certificate of dismissal from their respective election districts, as now provided by law; and all persons that reside within said limits, and would have been qualified to vote in any of one of the two districts from which the new district is formed, shall be entitled to register in said new district.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That a register of voters for said new district shall at once be appointed by the Governor of Maryland, as provided by law, and that two justices of the peace shall also be appointed by the Governor, as provided by law, for said new district, in addition to those justices who now reside within the limits of said new district, who shall continue to exercise all the functions of their offices until their successors are duly qualified and appointed according to law.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six, and thence on, as now provided by law, the Governor of Maryland shall appoint a register of voters and two justices of the peace for said new district; and at their usual time for appointing constables, as now provided by law, the County Commissioners of Dorchester county shall, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four, and thence on, appoint two constables for said new district; and a collector of taxes for the same shall be appointed as soon as may be convenient after the passage of this act, as provided by the local law of Dorchester county; and the County Commissioners of said county shall cause the assessable property of the said district, number two, or East New Market, and number twelve,
