

the board cannot agree upon such appointment, then the names of three persons who are eligible shall be submitted for selection for officers of registration, judge or clerk, as the case may be, by the supervisor or supervisors belonging to the leading political party entitled to be represented by such registration officer, judge or clerk; and out of said three names the other supervisor or supervisors representing the other leading political party of the state shall select the name of such registration officer, judge or clerk, who, when so selected, shall be appointed the registration officer, judge or clerk if otherwise eligible, and shall serve, unless excused by said board of supervisors of election. The said judges of election shall receive two dollars per diem each for their services. <sup>Compensa-</sup>tion. The compensation of such judges and clerks, and all expenses to be incurred by said judges under this sub-title or otherwise, according to law, as well as all expenses to be incurred by the said board of supervisors necessary and proper for the performance of their duties as aforesaid, or in execution thereof, including the cost of new registration books for the officers of registration whenever such new books shall be necessary, shall be paid and recoverable from the mayor and city council of Baltimore, and shall be provided for by said mayor and city council by taxation or otherwise.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this <sup>Effective.</sup> act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
