

every part thereof, so that they may be satisfied as to the structure thereof and that said boxes are empty. The boxes shall then be locked and the key delivered to one of the judges, and shall not be again opened until the closing of the polls ; and until such closing each box shall be kept constantly in sight of all persons entitled to be present, and shall be so placed that the voter offering his ballot and the judges and clerks and all persons entitled to be present may conveniently see every ballot deposited therein.

15. Every voter shall deliver to the judges of elections in the district or precinct in which he offers to vote, a ballot on which shall be written or printed the name or names of the person or persons voted for, and the purpose for which the vote is given, plainly designated ; and the ballot so delivered in and received by the judges of election shall be deposited in the ballot box until the polls be closed. One accredited representative of each and every political party whose candidates are voted for at each election, to be designated in writing by such candidates, and in case of his necessary absence a substitute, similarly selected, shall be entitled to be admitted into and remain in the polling room from the opening until the close of the election, and a refusal to admit any such representative shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding six months, or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

If at any election hereafter held in Baltimore city, or in any county, any person shall falsely personate any voter, and vote or attempt or offer to vote, in or upon the name of such voter, or shall vote or attempt to vote in or upon the name of any other person, whether living or dead, or in or upon any false, assumed or fictitious name, or in or upon any name not his own ; or shall knowingly, wilfully or fraudulently vote more than once for any candidate for the same office, except as authorized by law ; or shall vote, or attempt or offer to vote in any election precinct or district without being registered as a legal voter therein ; or shall vote more than once, or vote in more than one elec-
