AN ACT to repeal chapter two hundred and seven of the acts of eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "An act to add additional sections to the Code of Public Local Laws of Somerset County, entitled 'Revenue and Taxes.'" and enact the following in lieu thereof.

Repealed and re-enacted.

county shall, on or before the second Tuesday in April, in each year, beginning on the second Tuesday of April in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, appoint a collector of state and county taxes for each of said collection districts, who shall execute to the State of Maryland, on Bond for per- or before the second Tuesday of May then next of succeeding, a good and sufficient bond to be approved by the county commissioners, in a penalty double the amount of the state taxes that will be entrusted to him for collection, and conditioned for the true and faithful performance of his duty as collector, and, in like manner, on or before the

> second Tuesday of June, in the same year, another bond to the State of Maryland, to be also approved by the county commissioners, in a pen-
