

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That for the purpose of preserving order, enforcing the rules and regulations of said society, not inconsistent with the laws of this state, and for the protection of property, the several justices of the peace in Cecil county be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, upon the request of the president, vice-president, or any of the managers of said society, to summon and detail, in the name of the State of Maryland, such constabulary force as the president, vice-president, or managers of said society may deem sufficient for the perfect preservation of peace and order, the protection of property, and the full enforcement of the rules and regulations aforesaid, during any fair or exhibition of said society, and during such period thereafter, or prior thereto, as may be necessary for the protection thereof, and upon and around the grounds belonging to or controlled or used by the said society, which detailed force aforesaid shall have and exercise, in addition to the special power and authority conferred on them by this act, the same powers and authority as the several constables in the state now have as conservators of the peace.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any person who shall knowingly and wilfully violate any of the provisions of this act, or any of the by-laws, rules and regulations, or other enactments of the said society, not inconsistent with the laws of this state, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace of said county, each and every person so offending shall be fined by said justice of the peace a sum not less than one dollar and costs, nor more than five dollars and costs, for the first offence, and not less than five dollars and costs, nor more than twenty dollars and costs, for each and every offence committed thereafter; and upon the failure of any person or persons to pay the said fines and costs, the justice of the peace, before whom the same shall be tried shall commit them to the county jail, in said county until said fines and costs are paid.
