

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this corporation, or a majority of the members of the same, shall have full power to make a system of rules and regulations, under the denomination of a constitution and by-laws, or otherwise, not inconsistent with the laws of the state, for the management of the affairs of the said corporation, and the same to alter and amend, abrogate and annul, whenever they may think proper.

Corporate powers.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the object of the said corporation shall be the improvement of the breed of horses, and in carrying out the said object the said corporation shall have power to contract for the use, by any person or persons, of any track which they may establish or control, and may hold one or more meetings in each year, at such place as it may select for the exhibition and trial of such animals as it may deem proper, and may offer and give such premium as it may determine on for superiority in the object sought for.

Object of the corporation.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That for the purpose of preserving order and protecting property, the police commissioners of the city of Baltimore be and they are hereby authorized, upon the request of the president of said corporation, to detail such force as they may deem sufficient for the preservation of order during any exhibition of said corporation, which detailed force shall have the power that the police of the city have as conservators of the peace.

Police regulations.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage, and the legislature reserves the right to alter and amend this act at pleasure.

Effective and reserved right.
