

one of said oyster numbers not being in the jib as above set forth, which said fine and costs he fully paid; and,

WHEREAS, the said Dougherty had all the necessary licenses to catch oysters as required by the laws of the state, and there was no intentional violation of any law; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the comptroller of the treasury of Maryland be and he is hereby directed to draw his warrant on the treasurer of the state, in favor of said John H. Dougherty, for the sum of seventy-five dollars.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 145.

AN ACT to a further supplement to an act entitled "An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes," relating to the railway on the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike Road.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike Road be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make use of stored electricity as a motive power on their railway tracks on the said turnpike road, in order to promote more rapid transit thereon.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That the said president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Yorktown Road, before availing of the rights and privileges conferred by the first section of this act, shall be required to lay an additional track of railway on such portions of their railway where at present but a single track exists, only for the purposes set forth in
