Chapter 221.

AN ACT to repeal section thirty-six of chapter two hundred and sixteen of the acts of assembly, passed eighteen hundred and eighty-two, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "Cambridge," and to re-enact the same as amended, and to add additional sub-sections A, B and C, to create a police board and police for Cambridge, and define their duties.

Repealed and re-enacted.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section thirty-six of chapter two hundred and sixteen of the acts of assembly, passed in the session eighteen hundred and eighty-two, titled "Dorchester County," sub-titled "Cambridge," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows, and also to add additional sub-sections A, B and C, creating a police board and police for said town of Cambridge, and to define their duties.

Pay to commissioners.

SEC. 36. The county commissioners for Dorchester county shall, on the first day of October, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, and annually thereafter, pay to the commissioners of said town the sum of seven hundred dollars, out of the taxes levied and collected for roads in said county, to be applied, by the said town commissioners, for corporate purposes.

Police commissioners.

SEC. 36A. The mayor of the town of Cambridge, the president of the board of trade of said town, and the state's attorney for Dorchester county, shall constitute a board of police commissioners, to serve without pay, and they, or a majority of them, shall appoint, on or about the first day of October, of each and every year, four sober, discreet and muscular men for policemen, whose term of service shall be six months, unless sooner discharged for inefficiency or misconduct; the said police board, or a majority of them, shall fill all vacancies occasioned by resignation, death, discharge, or other causes, and shall have power to temporarily increase the number of police, and to temporarily appoint police from April to October, when, in their judgment, the
