Howard, late of Harford county, deceased, to the vestry of Saint James P. E. church of Baltimore county, for the purposes therein named ; fifty-ninth, to the bequests contained in the last will and testament of Moses D. Wheeler, late of Muskingum county, in the State of Ohio, to the trustees of the old Gunpowder church, in Baltimore county ; sixtieth, to the bequest contained in the last will and testament of Eliza Murdoch, late of Howard county, deceased, to the vestry of Zion Parish of the Protestant Episcopal church in Frederick county ; sixty-first, to the bequest contained in the last will and testament of Philip Hiss, late of Baltimore city, giving three thousand dollars to the Home for the Aged of the Methodist Episcopal church of Baltimore city ; sixty-second, to the bequest of Sarah A. Flint, of Baltimore city, of five hundred dollars to the Home for the Aged of the Methodist Episcopal church of Baltimore city.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

### Chapter 292.

AN ACT to enable the qualified voters of Harford county to determine, by ballot, whether spirituous or fermented liquors shall not be sold in said county, or shall be sold only as hereinafter described, and to repeal all acts inconsistent herewith.
