

Cumberland;" and whereas said corporation has been formed for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a "Home" for sick, aged, infirm and friendless people as an infirmary and hospital, to be under the control and management of the following named board of directors or managers: Robert Shriver, Lloyd Lowndes, William E. Weber, Charles H. Ohr, M. A. R. F. Carr, Mrs. C. James Orrick, Mrs. M. A. R. F. Carr, Mrs. Jacob Humbird, Mrs. R. E. Johnson, Sr., Mrs. A. F. Raffensperger, Mrs. Maria C. Little and Mrs. E. F. Giesse, who will direct or manage the concerns of said corporation for the first year; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer, on the warrant of the comptroller, be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the order of the board of directors or managers for "The Protestant Home and Infirmary of Western Maryland," in Cumberland, the sum of five thousand dollars, to be used in purchasing a suitable building and maintaining the same as a "Home" for sick, friendless, destitute and infirm persons. (Directed to pay.)

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.
