dollars, and such person in default of payment thereof may be committed to the county jail for a period of not more than five days. All fines, penalties and forfeitures under this sub-title and not otherwise provided for, shall be recovered before a justice of the peace for said county resident in said town, in the name of the commissioners, and applied to the benefit of said town, and in all such proceedings the bailiff shall have the same power to proceed in the same manner and have the same fees as constables, and for police duties shall be entitled to the same fees as constables, and all process shall be returnable before some justice of the peace resident in said town.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 67.

AN ACT to extend the corporate existence of the Gray Manufacturing Company.

Corporate
existence ex-
tended.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the corporate existence of the Gray Manufacturing Company, which was incorporated by chapter two hundred and seventy-one of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the December session, eighteen hundred and forty-four, be and the same hereby is extended for the period of forty years from the expiration of said original charter.
