Chapter 478.

AN ACT to add seven additional sections to article sixteen of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Chancery," to stand under the sub-title "Declaratory Decrees," and be numbered consecutively seventy-eight A, seventy-eight B, seventy-eight C, seventy-eight D, seventy-eight E, seventy-eight F and seventy-eight G.

Additional sections.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following be and they are hereby added as seven additional sections to article sixteen, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Chancery," to stand under the sub-title "Declaratory Decrees," and be numbered consecutively seventy-eight A, seventy-eight B, seventy-eight C, seventy-eight D, seventy-eight E, seventy-eight F and seventy-eight G, *Declaratory Decrees*.

Institute suit.

78A. Any person entitled to any legal character, or to any right as to any property, may institute a suit against any person denying, or interested to deny, his title to such legal character or right; and the court may, in its discretion, make therein a declaration that he is so entitled without any further or other relief being asked or given.

Shall not make

78B. No court shall make any such declaratory decree where the plaintiff being, in the opinion of such courts, able to seek further relief than a mere declaration of title omits to do so.

Trustee of property.

78C. A trustee of property is "A person interested to deny a title, adverse to the title or rights
