

the pleasure of said mayor and common council; and a tax shall be levied on said property to pay the interest thereon and create a sinking fund for payment of said bonds at maturity; said bonds shall be issued in sums not exceeding five hundred dollars each, with coupons attached, and shall be under the corporate seal of said town, and signed by the mayor and countersigned by the clerk of said common council.

Bonds—how issued.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That at the next election after the passage of this bill for mayor and common council for said town, the voters of said town shall write or print on their respective ballots—"For water-tax and for issue of bonds," or "Against water-tax and against the issue of bonds;" and the tax mentioned in section one of this act shall be levied only in case a majority of ballots shall be for said water-tax, and the bonds mentioned in section two of this act shall be issued only in case a majority of said ballots shall be "For issue of bonds," and not otherwise.

Ballots—how prepared.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
