

may be necessary ; for the contingent fund of the Court of Appeals, one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary ; for the contingent fund of the Board of Public Works, five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, said amount to be expended under the direction and control of said board, to be used for repairs to State property and other necessary expenses ; for the contingent fund of the Attorney General, for printing and traveling expenses, clerical services, stationery, postage and other necessary expenses, thirteen hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary ; for the contingent fund of the State Librarian, for postage, postage, freight, purchases of stationery and other incidental expenses, five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary ; said contingent fund to be paid upon the proper vouchers exhibit to the Comptroller.

STATE LIBRARY.

State library. For the augmentation and furnishing of the State Library, one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary ; to the State Librarian, for expenses in shipments of the Acts of Assembly, reports and documents of the session of nineteen hundred, three hundred and fifty dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

INSPECTION AND INSURANCE.

Inspection and insurance. For the payment of the annual ground rent on tobacco warehouse lots in Baltimore city, four hundred and forty-eight dollars and eleven cents ; for the salaries of two inspectors of steam boilers in the city of Baltimore, fifteen hundred dollars each—three thousand dollars ; for the salary of the Mine Inspector in Garrett and Allegany counties, fifteen hundred dollars ; for the rent of boxes in some safe deposit company, for the use of the Treasury Department, one hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary ; for insurance on public buildings of the State and on the personal property thereto belonging, the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

COMMISSIONERS OF FISHERIES.

Commissioners of fisheries. For the salaries of the two Commissioners of Fisheries, fifteen hundred dollars each—three thousand dollars ; and to defray the expenses of the Commissioners, as per section 89 of Article XXXIX of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Fish and Fisheries," sub-title "Commissioners of Fisheries," seventy-five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as in the opinion of the Governor may be necessary ; no part of the said appropriation to be expended in the killing of the eels in
