three (103) and one hundred and four (104) of Article twenty-seven (27) of the 'Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "Fraud—Fruit and Vegetables Packing."

Repeal.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections one hundred (100), one hundred and one (101), one hundred and two (102), one hundred and three (103) and one hundred and four (104) of Article twenty-seven (27) of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub title "Fraud—Fruit and Vegetable Packing," be and the same are hereby repealed.

Rffective.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 449.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 57, 59 and 62 of Article 72 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters," as said sections were enacted by Chapter 380 of the Acts of 1894.

Repeal.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections 57, 59 and 62 of Article 72 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters," as amended by chapter 380 of the Acts of 1894, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows:

Appoint ten persons. 57. The Governor, at each session of the General Assembly shall appoint ten persons to be known as the General Measurers and Inspectors of Oysters; and each general measurer and inspector shall give bond to the State of Maryland in the sum of three thousand dollars, with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Comptroller, for the faithful discharge of his duties, and each general measurer and inspector of oysters shall have full power and authority, in conformity to the provisions of this Article, over oysters in the waters adjacent to the port to which they shall be respectively assigned, as is given to all general measurers and inspectors of oysters by this Article.

Ten inspection districts. 59. At the beginning of each oyster season, the Commander of the State Fishery Force shall divide the inspection points into ten inspection districts, of which five districts shall be in the city of Baltimore, and five other districts as now located, which said districts shall be known as districts Nos. one to ten.
