

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That the name of the said body corporate be changed from the "Union League of Baltimore City" to the "Union League of Maryland." Name changed.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That the members of the said Union League of Maryland be and they are hereby empowered to elect such number of trustees, managers, directors or governors for the management of the property and concerns of said corporation, and in such manner and at such times and for such term or terms of office as the said league by its by-laws does now or shall hereafter prescribe. Election of officers.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT to add additional sections to Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," to come in after Section 256, and to be known as Sections 257 and 258 of said Article seven, and to be designated as sub-title "Gambling."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following sections be added to Article seven of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," to come in after section 256, and to be known as sections 257 and 258 of said Article seven, and to be designated as sub-title "Gambling." New section added.

257. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to play with cards or any other or different devices, any game or games of chance for money or other thing of value, upon or near to or in sight of any street, lane, alley, road, highway, path, footway or other public or private way, or upon any land, or in any house adjacent thereto, within the limits of said Corroll county; and any person violating the provisions of this section shall, on conviction in the Circuit Court for said county after indictment, be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars or imprisoned in the jail of the county or the House of Correction, in the discretion of said court, for a term not exceeding six months, or both fined and imprisoned, as said court may determine. Unlawful to gamble.
Penalty.

258. Nothing in the foregoing section shall be held to be a repeal in any respect of the general law prohibiting gambling; but the said foregoing section shall be construed as supple- Construction.
