SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State for the sum of six thousand six hundred and sixty-two and sixty-nine one hundredth dollars (\$6,662.69,) for stationery furnished for the use of the General Assembly of eighteen hundred and ninety-six; the executive department, Court of Appeals and State Library for eighteen hundred and ninety-six; the executive department, Court of Appeals and State Library for eighteen hundred and ninety-six and eighteen hundred and ninety seven, and the General Assembly of eighteen hundred and ninety eight.

CHAPTER 101.

AN ACT to perfect the title of The Glade Church, a body corporate of Frederick County, to five acres of ground in said County, upon which said church has heretofore erected and maintained a house of worship and a burying ground, and to sanction the acquisition and holding by the said The Glade Church of an additional lot or lots of ground in Walkersville, in said County, for church and parsonage purposes.

WHEREAS, It appears by an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the session begun on the fifth day of November, A. D. 1781, entitled "An Act to vest in the members of the German Reformed Church, an estate in fee simple in a lot of ground in Monocacy Manor, in Frederick County," that members of the German Reformed Church had erected a house for divine worship, called The Glade Church, on a lot of ground in Monocacy Manor, in Frederick county, belonging to the State of Maryland, and had enclosed said lot and made use of the same as a burying ground, and the said General Assembly did thereby enact that the surveyor of Frederick county should survey and lay off, within six months after the
