

Local Laws, title "Calvert County," sub-title "County Commissioners," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-^{Repeal.} enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows :

46 A. The three "County Commissioners for Calvert county," now constituting the Board of County Commissioners for said county, shall hold their office until the first ^{To hold office.} Tuesday after the first Monday in November, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

46 B. At the general election to be held in said county, on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, there shall be elected three County Commissioners, whose terms of office shall be for two years, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, and every two years thereafter at the general election to be held in said county there shall be elected three <sup>Three com-
missioners
to be
elected.</sup> County Commissioners, whose terms of office shall be for a period of two years, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

CHAPTER 165.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Charles County to levy a sum of money necessary to build a suitable school house in the Fifth Election District of Charles County for colored children, title "Charles County," sub-title "Public Schools."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Charles county be and they are hereby authorized and directed to levy at the next levy laying a sum of money necessary to build a suitable school house in the fifth election district of Charles county for colored children. <sup>Levy to be
made.</sup>

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. ^{Effective.}

CHAPTER 166.

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 10 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Attorneys at Law and Attorneys in Fact," to follow Section 9, and to be designated as "Section 9 A."
