nor more than two hundred dollars, and his license may, in the discretion of the court, be suppressed.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 178.

AN ACT to repeal Section 135 of Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Gravevard Desecration," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section 135 of Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Graveyard Desecration," be and the same is hereby Repeal. repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows:

135. Any justice of the peace in this State, except civil magistrates in the city of Baltimore, shall have jurisdiction under this Act.
