

110. The treasurer shall keep his office open in the court house, at Upper Marlboro, in said county, from ten o'clock A. M. until three o'clock P. M. each day, Sundays and legal holidays excepted, for the purpose of discharging the duties of his office. He shall also, in person or by deputy, attend, one day in the month of June, and one day in the month of September of each year, in each election district of said county, for the purpose of collecting taxes payable to him, and he shall give at least ten days' notice of the times and places of such attendance, in one newspaper published in said county, and by handbills posted in each district. He shall, upon payment thereof, deliver to the taxpayer a receipted bill, containing each item of real estate, and the aggregate of personalty therein embraced.

Office hours.

111. The treasurer shall at the end of his term of office, deliver up the office to his successor, and all papers and books relative thereto, except the books containing taxes of the last annual levy uncollected by him and for which his bond is responsible; and he shall be allowed nine months thereafter to complete the collection of the same, and to make final settlement with the County Commissioners of Prince George's county and the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, said books retained by him, as hereinbefore provided, shall not be removed, however, from the treasurer's office.

Office delivered up to his successor.

112. The treasurer shall be entitled to a clerk to be appointed by himself, and for whose official conduct he shall be responsible, said clerk shall be paid five hundred dollars per annum by the County Commissioners of Prince George's county.

Clerk appointed.

113. All county taxes shall be paid in cash or in the matured coupons of Prince George's county bonds; and all money collected by the treasurer and belonging to said county shall be deposited by him, as soon as collected, in a safe bank in the name of the treasurer of said county and not in his individual name.

How taxes shall be paid.

114. All county taxes shall be due on the first day of July next succeeding their levy, and shall bear interest from that date. On such as remain unpaid after the first day of November following, there shall accrue, in addition to said interest, a penalty of one-half of one per cent, for each whole month that they may elapse thereafter, until payment or a sale for default which is finally ratified by the court.

When due.

115. The treasurer shall be the collector of all State and county taxes levied by the County Commissioners of Prince
