memorandum is hereby required to be taken by the treasurer; and to enter such redemption upon his books and over his signature, upon the report of sale dealing with the property The treasurer shall, also, deposit the redemption money in some national bank in the name of the County Commissioners of Prince George's county, which shall be designated as "Tax Sale Redemption Fund," be kept separate from the other funds of the county, and be only payable to the persons entitled to the same. A book shall be kept by the treasurer entitled "Tax Sale Redemption Fund," which shall show the receipts and deposits of said fund and payment thereof to those entitled to the same.

116 c. Any surplus of purchase money over and above taxes, interest, penalties and costs of sale, received by the treasurer, Deposited in shall be deposited in some national bank, in the name of the County Commissioners of Prince George's county, be designated as "Tax Sale Surplus Fund," be kept separate from the other funds of the county, and be only payable to the persons entitled to the same. A book shall be kept by the treasurer, entitled "Tax Sale Surplus Fund," which shall show the receipts and deposits of said fund, and payment thereof to those entitled to the same.

116 D. Taxes as collected shall be credited to the respective appropriations of the levy; and the treasurer shall each month How make written report to the County Commissioners of all moneys received and disbursed by him since his last report.

116 E. The treasurer shall be entitled to a commission of three and one-half per centum on the amount of State and county taxes collected and paid over by him, which shall be in full commission. for his services in discharge of his duties, except the fees hereinafter allowed for enforcing payment of taxes, and for listing or valuing new or omitted property; and in his reports of collections he may credit himself with his commissions on the county taxes collected by him. He shall also be paid by the County Commissioners his commissions on the State taxes collected by him, as he may from time to time present his receipts from the Treasurer of Maryland; and upon a final settlement with the County Commissioners for each annual levy, he shall be allowed commissions on the whole amount of State and county taxes collected by him, and be charged with the amounts of commissions he shall have theretofore retained as above provided.
