SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect Reflective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 388.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 146, 147, 148 and 149 of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland. entitled "Elections," sub-titled "Congressional Districts," as the same were amended and re-enacted by the Act of 1896, chapter 202, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections 146, 147, 148 and 149 of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, entitled "Elec-Répeal tions," sub-titled "Congressional Districts," as the same were amended and re-enacted by the Act of 1896, chapter 202, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows;

146. The second congressional district shall be composed of the twelfth, sixteenth, seventeenth and eighteenth wards of Baltimore city, of Cecil county, Harford county, Carroll Second concounty, and the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, fourteenth and fifteenth election districts of Baltimore county, and said counties and election districts and wards shall be entitled to choose one representative in the House of Representatives.

147. The third congressional district shall be composed of the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and Third congressions ninth wards of Baltimore city, and shall be entitled to choose one representative in the House of Representatives.

148. The fourth congressional district shall be composed of the tenth, eleventh, thirteenth, fourteenth, fifteenth, nineteenth,
