

saloon territory by a druggist or pharmacist of liquor for medical or sacramental purposes only, or of alcohol for medicinal, chemical or mechanical purposes only, not to be drunk upon the premises under any circumstances; provided, the following requirements are fully complied with and such druggist or pharmacist in good faith shall keep a true and exact record in a book, which he shall provide for the purpose, in which shall be entered at the time of every sale of intoxicating liquors made by him or in or about his place of business to all persons whomsoever, the date of such sale, the name of the purchaser, who shall also sign his name in said book as a part of said entry, and his residence (stating the street and house number if there be such), the kind, quantity and price of such liquor, the purpose for which it was sold, and when the sale is for medical purposes; the book shall also contain the name of the physician issuing the prescription therefor, such prescription shall be cancelled by writing on it the word "Cancelled," and the date on which it was presented and filed, and kept on file; no prescription shall be filled a second time. Such book shall be in form substantially as follows:

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And the book and all such prescriptions before provided for, shall be open to inspection by any State's Attorney, justice of the peace having criminal jurisdiction, judge of any court, or any sheriff, constable or other police officer. Any druggist or pharmacist who shall fail to keep such record, or shall fail or refuse to make any entry therein required by law, or shall destroy or alter or change in any way any such record or any entry therein any prescription, or permit or procure the same to be destroyed, altered or changed, or shall fail to cancel any such prescription, or shall refill any prescription or shall sell intoxicating liquors for medical purposes, except in written prescriptions or for sacramental purposes without an order signed by a clergyman, shall for each sale in violation of the provisions of this section be deemed guilty of unlawful selling, and on conviction thereof, shall be punished accordingly. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a sale by such druggist of such liquor as may be needed by or for a sick person in case of extreme illness, when delay may be dangerous to the patient. It shall be unlawful for any druggist or pharmacist who has been convicted of selling intoxicating liquor in violation of this Act, thereafter to sell intoxicating liquor for
