izing that section of the Maryland-Virginia road, known as 'The White Ground,' beginning at Boyd's Station and running southerly towards the town of Dawsonville, Montgomery county, for a distance of two miles" is hereby disapproved.

Provision 111, on page 21 of the enrolled Act, being item "to I. M. Swettenheim and Blanche T. Newman, of the city of Baltimore, as executor and executrix of the estate of Henry Newman, deceased, for the purchase of an historical oil painting by Emanuel Leutze, entitled "The Settlement of Maryland," the sum of eleven thousand five hundred dollars" is hereby disapproved.

Provision 112, on page 21 of the enrolled Act, item "to the United Patriotic Home for Orphan Children of Maryland, the sum of \$500 for the fiscal year 1909, and the like sum of \$500 for the fiscal year 1910" is hereby disapproved.

CHAPTER 290.

AN ACT to incorporate the "Eastern Trust and Investment Company of Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Henry Kolb, William J. Biddison, John Byrne, James Rittenhouse, James Douglas, of Baltimore county and State of Maryland; Edward L. Ward, William T. Dietrich and Clarence W. Perkins, of Baltimore city, in said State; Richard A. Johnson, of Howard county, in said State, their associates
