

penalty of twenty dollars for each offense, together with the expenses of burying or removing the same, and any other person who shall bury or remove any dead carcass or offensive carrion, thrown out and deposited contrary to the provisions of this section, shall recover, before any justice of the peace, against the person guilty of such offense, all expenses incurred in burying and removing the same.

129. Any person occupying any real property or chattels real in Baltimore county, either as tenant or owner thereof, or any person owning unoccupied real estate or chattels real in said county who shall knowingly allow any dead carcass of any domestic animal to be exposed upon premises without burial for a longer period than twenty-four hours, shall upon conviction thereof be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a fine of twenty dollars, or imprisonment for not less than ten days for each offense, in the discretion of the court.

130. The County Commissioners are authorized to employ a sufficient number of men with horses and carts for the removal of garbage, ashes, and all other offal in such thickly populated places as they shall consider necessary, and the district health officers shall have supervision and control of the persons so employed as removers of garbage in their respective districts, and shall report any failure or delinquency on their part to the local health board.

131. All residents in such places in Baltimore county, as may be supplied with a force for the collection of garbage ashes and other offal, shall collect all offal accumulating on their premises into suitable receptacles, and put them in a place convenient to the removers of garbage and other offal; any resident who shall allow such garbage or offal to accumulate on his premises, without so collecting and so placing it, after receiving notice from the county or district health officer to do so, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine of not less than one dollar, nor more than five dollars for each such offense.

132. The County Commissioners are hereby authorized and empowered to pass rules and regulations governing the disposal of urinary and fecal matter, and any other form of sewerage in any part of Baltimore county not incompatible with the Public General Laws or with rules and regulations of the State Board of Health, and any person refusing or neglecting to obey the rules and regulations of the said County Commissioners shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined ten dollars, and each day that any person shall continue to dispose of any sewerage in violation of
